Since 2006, our library has lost a significant amount of funding due to state budget cuts and the poor state of the economy. All areas of our budget have been cut, but our budget for books and other materials took the hardest hit. The amount we spend on books, CDs, audio books, magazines and other library materials has decreased by more than 35% since 2006.

We honestly don't know what the future holds for library funding. So we're making every effort to spend wisely and to find ways we can increase our income.

We know our wide variety of popular, up-to-date materials is one of the reasons you come to our library, so we are asking for your assistance. Here are two ways you can help Fill Our Shelves:
