Discussion Questions:

- 1. What is the significance of the title? Whose elevation do you think King is referring to?
- 2. Early in the novel, Scott thinks, "Time is invisible. Unlike weight." He reconsiders this and decides that weight, "like time, basically [is] just a human construct... trying to measure invisible forces that had visible effects....[a] feeble effort to corral some greater reality beyond what mere humans thought of as reality...." (17-18) Do you agree? Must the reader accept this construct if he is to grasp the messages of King's novel?
- 3. What is the novel pointing out about the assumptions that we all make daily? Which character suffers most from these assumptions?
- 4. How does Scott grow as a character throughout the novel? Dr. Bob? Deirdre?
- 5. If you are a Stephen King fan, you know that anything is possible in Castle Rock. Is this setting essential for the story King sets out to tell?
- 6. Near the end as Deirdre helped to unbuckle Scott from his chair, she rose herself each time that she touched him. What message is King sending here?
- 7. If you were to recommend this novel to someone outside Page Turners, what would you tell them to encourage them to read it?
